



TIME WARNER CABLE AMONG FIRST SERVICE PROVIDERS TO EARN ETHERNET CERTIFICATION

MEF 14 Certification Furthers Time Warner Cable's Leadership in Achieving Standards-Based, Carrier-Grade Ethernet Services for Business Customers

CHICAGO, IL June 20, 2007 -- Time Warner Cable Business Class (TWCBC), a leading provider of data, voice, video and security solutions for businesses, today announced that its carrier-class Ethernet networks have received MEF 14 Certification compliance from the Metro Ethernet Forum (MEF). TWCBC is in the first group of service providers to earn MEF-14 status.

MEF 14 Certification defines a series of requirements and test procedures used to verify that the service delivered to the subscriber conforms to the criteria specified as part of Service Level Agreements (SLAs) for Ethernet service. These tests are an essential part of the deployment of carrier-grade Ethernet services, as they provide a baseline for Service Performance and Bandwidth Profile Rate Enforcement categories. The certification testing and authorization was performed for MEF by Iometrix, Inc., a leading independent testing lab.

"MEF 14 Certification is further indication of our leadership in delivering high quality, standards-based Ethernet services to our customers," said Ken Fitzpatrick, senior vice president, Time Warner Cable Business Services. "We continually strive to offer our customers best-in-class technology as evidenced by the evolution of our Ethernet solutions."

MEF 14 Certification is just the latest significant MEF milestone for TWCBC, which earned MEF 9 Certification in October 2006. These certifications mean that TWCBC customers are assured that their Ethernet services provide guaranteed bandwidth for any application between two or more remote locations.

"MEF 14 focuses on the performance and quality of service issues that identify Carrier Ethernet's suitability for mission critical business applications."
